I. ACCOMPLISHMENTS – Nine members of the department will be recognized for heroism at incidents in 2021 at the Lehigh Valley Burn Foundation Preferred Spirit of Courage Award banquet on Tuesday October 18 at Lehigh Valley Hospital Muhlenberg – Bethlehem, PA.

II. I will be attending the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial service the weekend of October 7-9 at the National Fire Academy. Firefighter/EMT Mark “Dewey” Kulp whom we lost to COVID on January 5, 2021 will be honored. I will serve as an escort for his family throughout the weekend.

III. Firefighter James “Corky” Lerch Jr whom we lost on October 28, 2020 to job related cancer was honored at the IAFF Fallen firefighters Memorial in Colorado Springs, CO on September 17. His wife was in attendance and escorted by FF/EMT Corbin Keiser, who described the weekend as very humbling and moving.

Noteworthy responses:

August 5 – MCI event at the YMCA due to a chemical mix up. 20 civilians transported by City and County EMS units for minor exposure. Situation was contained by FD personnel. EMS station was used as a shelter for the children that were evacuated.

August 13 – Fire involving 3 cars, 3 garages, 4 homes rear of 300 Block N.9th St and 4 homes in the 300 block of Cedar Street. 2 alarms with the bulk of the fire knocked down quickly by the 18 FF on duty.

Kudos to them and the Chiefs for containing what was a massive fire upon arrival.
