 - Chief Tornielli inquired regarding the effect of additional working hours on a retired Police Officer's pension, when the individual was re-hired through the City of Reading.
 - Solicitor Rudolf: will research and provide a response.
 - Email from Joe advises the following:
 - *All, I'm following up on Chief Tornielli's question at Thursday's Board meeting on what, if any, issues arise when the City re-employs a retired Police Officer receiving an normal age and service pension benefit from the Police Pension Fund and becomes a Member of the O&E Fund by virtue of the re-employment. The short answer is that the re-employment of the retired Police Officer as a civilian who would now contribute to the O&E Fund and begin earning another pension with the O&E Fund has no impact. This individual continues to receive his Police Pension benefit and would begin earning a 2nd pension with the O&E Fund.*
