

Meeting Report

Attendance: S. Marmarou, R. Corcoran

Others Attending: S. Katzenmoyer

The meeting was called to order at 4:00 pm by Mr. Marmarou.

I. Interviews

Lynn Smith (reappointment – Animal Control Board)

Mr. Marmarou questioned how long Ms. Smith was involved with this Board. Ms. Smith stated that she has been a member since 2009 but that no meetings have been held since 2009.

Ms. Katzenmoyer stated that this Board is in need of additional members. Ms. Smith noted that the Board needs to be updated and reorganized.

Mr. Marmarou questioned if Ms. Smith was willing to continue membership. Ms. Smith stated that she is.

Mr. Marmarou stated that there have been fewer animal issues recently. Ms. Katzenmoyer stated that there was a bite by a pit bull this past weekend. Ms. Smith stated that the feral

cat problems continue. She stated that “No Nonsense” conducts high volume, low cost neutering for feral cats and performs them for the owners and anyone who traps them.

The Nominations and Appointments Committee recommends the reappointment of Lynn Smith to the Animal Control Board.

Brian Fichthorn (reappointment – Main Street Board)

Mr. Marmarou questioned why Mr. Fichthorn was interested in continuing to serve the City in this capacity. Mr. Fichthorn stated that he grew up in the City and is passionate about its revitalization. He stated that he is also President of Genesis Theater.

Mr. Marmarou questioned if there were problems this Board was facing. Mr. Fichthorn stated that there are no issues. He stated that much is progressing now that the City has received Main St designation and funding.

Mr. Corcoran stated that these are great and exciting times for the City.

Mr. Marmarou questioned if Genesis has considered moving the theater location. Mr. Fichthorn stated that it was considered but that Genesis owns the building and has a parking lot. He stated that they have formed an alliance with the Reading Civic Opera and the Reading Community Players.

Mr. Marmarou thanked Mr. Fichthorn for his service.

The Nominations and Appointments Committee recommends the reappointment of Brian Fichthorn to the Main Street Board.

Ms. Reed arrived at this time.

Jeff Darlington (reappointment – Board of Ethics)

Mr. Marmarou questioned why Mr. Darlington was interested in continuing to serve on this Board. Mr. Darlington stated that there is still work to do. He stated that there have not been many meetings lately but that the Board has completed its work on the “Pay to Play” legislation.

Mr. Marmarou questioned if there were problems the Board was facing. Mr. Darlington stated that there are none. He stated that Ms. Katzenmoyer does a great job coordinating

everything and communicating with Board members. He stated that the Board also gets wonderful support from its solicitor at Roland Stock. He noted the importance of the work of this Board.

Mr. Marmarou questioned if there was any recent complaint activity. Mr. Darlington stated that most complaints are dismissed by the Investigative Officer and do not reach the Board. He stated that there is currently one complaint before the Board.

Ms. Reed stated that she is happy that Mr. Darlington is willing to continue to serve the City. Mr. Darlington stated that he is glad to see progress in the City.

The Nominations and Appointments Committee recommends the reappointment of Jeff Darlington to the Board of Ethics.

Craig Breneiser (appointment – Fire Civil Service Board)

Ms. Reed questioned how Mr. Breneiser learned of this vacancy. Mr. Breneiser stated that he was approached by Mike Leifer to serve.

Ms. Reed stated that Mr. Breneiser has an excellent background for this position. Mr. Breneiser stated that he has been in the field for almost 40 years. He stated that he is also interested in serving because of the Fire Department's affiliation with his late wife who was employed here and was very happy.

Mr. Marmarou questioned if Mr. Breneiser had an understanding of the function of this Board. Mr. Breneiser stated that his understanding is that the Board works to have the best qualified people hired by the Fire Department in a fair and impartial way.

Ms. Reed stated that she is glad Mr. Breneiser is interested in serving the City.

The Nominations and Appointments Committee recommends the appointment of Craig Breneiser to the Fire Civil Service Board.

Pamela Cianciosi (reappointment – Citizens Advisory Board)

Ms. Cianciosi was interviewed via speakerphone.

Mr. Marmarou stated that he is glad that Ms. Cianciosi is interested in serving. He noted the rough start to this Board. Ms. Cianciosi noted her hope that additional people be

appointed to the Board for it to be more successful. She stated that there is currently no faith in the City government.

Ms. Cianciosi stated that she listens carefully to the presentations by the Administration and airs her concerns. She stated that she will continue to question issues until she is satisfied with the information she is given. She stated that additional members will have additional viewpoints.

Mr. Corcoran stated that people need to continue to ask questions.

Ms. Cianciosi stated that the Board is functioning better now but that people who are more knowledgeable in local events are needed.

The Nominations and Appointments Committee recommends the reappointment of Pamela Cianciosi to the Citizens Advisory Board.

II. Other Business



The meeting was called to order at 4:04 pm by Mr. Marmarou.

I. Interviews

There was discussion about Ms. Howze not being a City resident or having a business interest in the City.

Delphia Howze (appointment – Diversity Board)

Mr. Corcoran questioned how long Ms. Howze has been employed by Penske. Ms. Howze stated that she has been with Penske for five years.

Mr. Marmarou questioned which building she worked in. Ms. Howze stated that she works in the building on Route 10.

Mr. Marmarou questioned how Ms. Howze learned of this opportunity. Ms. Howze stated that the United Way has a “Blueprint for Leadership” program which encourages business professionals to be involved in the community and that she was also invited to apply by Mr. Thompson from the local chapter of the NAACP.

Mr. Marmarou questioned if Ms. Howze was a member of any other City board. Ms. Howze stated that she was not.

Mr. Corcoran questioned the duties of Ms. Howze's position at Penske. Ms. Howze stated that she oversees the EEOC, diversity, and inclusion issues for HR. She stated that she works on strategies and training for Penske and looks for mentoring opportunities. She stated that she also monitors demographics for new opportunities.

Mr. Marmarou questioned how many employees work for Penske. Ms. Howze stated that it is 1,800 locally and 17,000 corporate-wide.

Mr. Corcoran questioned what Ms. Howze would bring to this Board. Ms. Howze stated that she has a huge interest in this issue and that she would bring great understanding and experience to the Board. She stated that she has the background and experience needed to do the job and would bring a new point of view as she is originally from Pittsburgh. She stated that she would bring passion to her service and believes this is an integral issue for the City.

Mr. Corcoran thanked Ms. Howze for coming forward. Ms. Howze noted her hope that she be appointed.

After Ms. Howze left the meeting, Mr. Marmarou noted his objection to this appointment as Ms. Howze is not a City resident and does not have a business interest in the City. He noted that he has personal difficulty with Council continuing to name non-residents to BACs.

Mr. Corcoran stated that Council has that option if the candidate has the qualifications needed.

Mr. Marmarou suggested putting Ms. Howze on the agenda for the full vote of Council.

Mr. Corcoran recommends the appointment of Delphia Howze to the Diversity Board.

James McDevitt (appointment – Human Relations Commission)

Mr. Marmarou questioned if Mr. McDevitt was related to former Mayor McDevitt. Mr. McDevitt stated that he is originally from Philadelphia and has lived in Reading since October 2012. He stated that he is not related to former Mayor McDevitt.

Mr. Corcoran questioned why Mr. McDevitt was interested in serving on this Commission. Mr. McDevitt stated that he was involved in the Mayor's LGBT Council in Philadelphia. He stated that he has many personal experiences with this issue and that it is close to his heart. He noted his hope that he can assist others.

Mr. Marmarou questioned which Mayor was in office during his service on the LGBT Council. Mr. McDevitt stated that it was Mayor Nutter.

Mr. Corcoran stated that Mr. McDevitt has a great background and experience to serve in this capacity. Mr. McDevitt stated that he looks forward to serving.

The Nominations and Appointments Committee recommends the appointment of James McDevitt to the Human Relations Commission.

Daniel Laws Jr (appointment – Downtown Improvement District Authority)

Mr. Corcoran questioned why Mr. Laws was interested in serving. Mr. Laws stated that he is currently a member of the promotional committee but wants to serve at a higher level. He stated that some issues being considered by DID are not in the best interest of the City and this will increase his ability to impact change. He stated that his business is located at 5th & Penn Sts and DID regulations directly affect him and his business.

Mr. Marmarou noted the excellent background of Mr. Laws.

The Nominations and Appointments Committee recommends the appointment of Daniel Laws Jr to the Downtown Improvement District Authority.

The Nominations and Appointments Committee adjourned at 4:51 pm.



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
